It's About Time

Wednesday, February 16th, 2011 7:00-8:00 PM

Clock and timepiece historian Vance Bryant will be exhibiting a diverse and exciting collection of American clocks at the Town of Ballston Community Library all throughout the month of February. The opening reception and presentation will be held on Wednesday, February 16th, 2011 from 7:00 PM to 8:00 PM in the Town of Ballston Community Library's Community Room at 2 Lawmar Lane, Burnt Hills.

President of the National Association of Watch and Clock Collectors (NAWCC) Rip Van Winkle Chapter, Mr. Bryant will lecture about the history of clock making in America.

Mr. Bryant's presentation will cover a compendium of American clock history; from the early works of 18^{th} century colonists, through the innovations and developments of American clock producers in the early 19^{th} century, up to the great expansion of American clock making during the Industrial Revolution of the mid 19^{th} century.

Patrons are also encouraged to bring their own mechanical clocks (not electrical or quartz battery powered) for evaluation. Some historical information will be provided along with an informal estimate of value based on the current market.
