Summer Reading at the Town of Ballston Community Library

Dear Readers,

The Town of Ballston Community Library will be participating in "Dream Big—Read!" as a part of the 2012 Summer Reading at New York Libraries Program by offering free programs that include books, crafts and activities for all children from babies to teens. Studies show that summer reading helps with school success all year!

Sign-up begins at $10:00\,AM$ on Saturday, June~23 in the Children's Room. You can begin tracking your reading then. Our End of Summer Party will be on August~3 for participants and their families. The last day to pick up prizes will be August~10.

For the programs that require registration we ask that you choose one program per week. During sign-up you may register for the programs in weeks one through three. During week three, you may sign up for week four, five and six programs. You may attend as many of the non-registration programs as you'd like. Please CALL if you cannot make it to a program you are registered to attend. Anyone who is a no call/no show will not be allowed to participate in future registration programs during the summer. You must be registered for the summer reading program to attend any of the programs.

Reading Program

Participating in the Reading Program Challenge is easy! All you need to do is sign up and read. Once again we will be doing a BINGO Challenge with one card for each week.

HOW TO USE YOUR READING RECORD:

- Keep track of the activities you complete each week by using the BINGO grids.
- When you have completed that week's BINGO (vertical, horizontal or diagonal) you can come in for a prize —up to five per week!
- You cannot jump ahead, but you can go back and make up any missed weeks (i.e. you were sick or on vacation).
- Bring this card with you when you check in at the library; you cannot collect prizes without it.

Everyone who completes 3 weeks of the challenge can attend our End of Summer Party on *Friday*, *August 3*.
