
How Do We Sponsor The Museum Pass Program?



Library Museum Pass Program Guidelines

- Passes are available from the Town of Ballston Community Library.
- Passes must be returned to a staff member at the Town of Ballston Community Library Circulation
 Desk during regular library hours. Do not use a Drop Box or return them to another library.
- Passes may be checked out by library patrons (18 and older) who possess a valid library card in good standing.
- Passes are first-come, first served; there are no requests or renewals.
- There is a limit of one pass per family at any one time.
- Loan period: 3 days.
- Overdue fee: \$5 per day.
- Contact museum for schedule and hours.
- The borrower will be responsible for the replacement cost listed on the pass if it is lost or stolen.

- Children 6 & under always free.
- o Replacement fee: \$85

- Pass admits 1 family of 4- must include 1 adult 18 years or older.
- Pass does NOT include SRV rides (Simulated Reality Vehicle rides).
- o Replacement fee: \$50

- o Pass can only be used once per day.
- o Replacement fee: \$10

The Suite-Bueche Planetarium features the GOTO Star Projector. One of only twelve in the country, the GOTO offers a real-life view of the night sky not available anywhere else in the Northeast. Our Archives include 1.6 million images from the General Electric Photograph Collection, and attracts researchers from across the county and the world. Tours are available.
